Wednesday November 29	Quick Write (with model first) Quick Write 1. Write today's date and the heading "Biography" in your writer's notebook. 2. Think of a person who is inspiring to you. This could be someone you know personally or someone you know because they are famous. 3. Begin writing a biography about this person. Things to consider include: -Who is this person and what do they do? -What character traits do you see in them? How do they demonstrate those traits? (Write these so that they're inferential, not literal.) -What events have influenced this person's life? How has the time period been influential, if at all?

Next Steps...

Use yesterday's web and today's web to come up with a cohesive paragraph about how these traits in this person have influenced YOU. Try to NOT say the traits...

EX: I often think of my dad when my birthday comes around. I wonder, "Do I **need** a new sweater? Can I go **without** those boots?" In fact, Mrs. Field made me go shopping one time, because I kept wearing the same things! When something gets tough in my life, I often smile thinking of how he'd deal with it. I can get through tough times, too. I have everything I need, and then some.

EX: Whenever I'm at home watching TV or searching Pinterest, I often feel guilty for being so lazy. Even if I feel I deserve a break, I know that my dad would be up doing something if he were here today. So, my breaks usually don't last long; I'm motivated to find something to clean, something to make, or some plans to create. I also feel guilty sometimes when I'm talking to my daughter and she says, "You're joking, right?" I joke around with her so much that she's not always sure when I'm serious! However, even though I sometimes feel guilty about these things, I know that I'm doing the best I can and that my dad would be proud of me.
