Science Fiction

Genre video

Usually set in the future Based on real science

Built upon a "what if" question

Realistic and out-of-the-ordinary elements

Has a serious message (or warning) that's inferential

Types: new worlds, robots/humanoids, aliens, space ships & battles, inventions

SCI-FI AUTHORS WRITE ABOUT WHAT IF AND WHAT COULD BE

Discussion question: Can WHERE you are change WHO you are? If you were to move away from everything you know, how much of who you are would CHANGE, and how much would stay the same?

Begin reading "Dark They Were and Golden-Eyed"

As we read, write three questions you have.

Independent Reading

Focus: What genre is your book? What common characteristics of this genre are you noticing?

Wednesday December 13

Book Talks / Sci. Fi. Book Trailers

Discuss three questions from yesterday with peers, then ask the entire class ONE of them. Quick discussion about mood in stories
