Find evidence to support your claim. 3. Explain why you used that specific evidence. Pre-Reading Activity to get ready for tomorrow: The Situation: You are a student in a class with someone who is blind. Your job is to explain the concept of a color to that student. Consider: How would you express to the student what blue is? What is green, yellow, red? How would you "show" him/her what color is? Remember the student cannot see- your description should appeal vividly to his/her other senses!! Directions: 1. Choose a color to describe- how does it taste/smell/feel/sound?
