Monday October 23	Book Talks No Red Ink (See Schoology for "how-to" video) Set-up your interests Pre-Assessment Review storyboards and revise if needed Independent Reading (& 1:1 grade conferences)	
Tuesday October 24	Practice Grammar Sentence Book Talks Review AoW from Friday (Grammie came in for the last two classes and read us <u>The Sweetest Fig!</u>) Start typing our stories Independent Reading (& 1:1 grade conferences)	
Wednesday October 25	Book Talks Grammar "quiz" Writing - Introductions - Hooks / Leads Continue writing - experiment with three different hooks/leads Independent Reading (& 1:1 grade conferences) Focus: What would be a good hook to introduce someone to that part of your book? Remember, you want to grab their attention and make them want to continue reading. Explain why you think this is a good hook that leads to the rest of the plot.	
Thursday October 26	Book Talks Writing - Introduction to "snapshot" and "slo-mo" (slow motion) writing Continue writing - experiment with snapshot and slow motion Independent Reading Focus: Tell about a time when your author created a snapshot or slow motion technique? If you cannot find one, explain where the author could have added one of these techniques.
